



Historian and former “GLORE” Visiting Fellow and Associated Researcher Awarded Prestigious ‘Best History Book Prize’

Dr. Katarzyna Nowak, a historian and former “GLORE” Visiting Fellow and Associated Researcher, has been awarded the second prize in the prestigious Best History Book Prize of the Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs for her monograph *Kingdom of Barracks. Polish Displaced Persons in Allied-Occupied Germany and Austria* (McGill-Queens University Press, 2023).

The book has been reviewed very positively in the community and found high praise amongst colleagues.

The Polish Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Best History Book Prize recognizes outstanding foreign-language books on Polish history. The international jury, composed of 11 distinguished historians and public intellectuals, selected the book from a large and highly competitive field of submissions from scholars around the world, highlighting the global interest in Polish history and its international dimensions. This year's award recipients also included the British writer Claire Mulley and the Australian journalist Anthony Sharwood.

The prize was officially conferred by Poland's Minister of Foreign Affairs, Radosław Sikorski, at a ceremony held in Warsaw.
